While many fruits contain more calories due to their higher sugar content, they also contain fiber, which makes them a better choice for dessert than ice cream or baked goods. Berries are low in sugar but high in fiber, making them the best choice for fruits while on a diet.

Eat More Protein

Sugars and starches digest quickly and can leave you feeling hungry again much sooner. Protein digests much slowerthan carbohydrates, so it will also help you feel fuller, longer, with less calories.

Fat also digests slowerthan carbohydrates, but fat contains more calories per gram and too much can lead to heart problems; speak with your doctor before beginning a high-fat diet.
